New State-Mandated Pharmacy Laws

There are new state-mandated Pharmacy Laws that will change our verification process when filling medications. Effective today, every filled medication leaving the hospital must be visually verified by a doctor. Zero exceptions.

Basically, there has to be a dispensing log - it can be done in excel, and signed at the end of the day. The prescribing vet has to visually verify the medication before being dispensed to a client (not just 2 employee initials). Log should have the date, patient name, drug name, strength, and amount being dispensed. This has applied to doctors and pharmacists, and now will apply to veterinarians.

- (F) A prescriber may designate a health care professional acting within the scope of the professional's practice and, under the supervision of the prescriber, to prepare and package a dangerous drug that will be personally furnished by the prescriber.
- (G) A prescriber shall perform the final check of the dangerous drug prior to personally furnishing. The final check shall be documented using positive identification pursuant to rule <u>4729-5-01</u> of the Administrative Code.
