FIND YOUR ROAD TO HAPPINESS

After a long busy work day, we sit down and check our email, Facebook groups, and veterinary websites. We get bombarded with how "Registered Veterinary Technicians are in high demand." RVT shortage is all over.

The next screen is "How To Prevent Burnout" and "The average technician only lasts 5 years." After skimming the headlines, we glanced over at the treadmill we planned tonight.

We're just too exhausted to move a muscle. Here is where we lie for the rest of the night.

All those titles are true, there is no arguing that. There is a reason you went into this field. You went to school, studied, and changed your life to get this degree.

We worked hard for this title! Why are you so quick to give all that up after 5 years? When and where did you lose the passion?

Think back to when you got accepted in The Veterinary Technology Program. How excited you were, and every animal you were going to help!

Now that you are here, you made it! You accomplished your goal; You're a Registered Veterinary Technician! Are you happy? If not, why not?

There are so many career paths our Veterinary Technician license will take us. Let's analyze them. Your happiness is down one of these roads. Maybe even a couple roads, you're not limited to one road.

General Practice: Learn your skills, get your comfort level up, continue your education, and get mentored. On the flip side, an experienced RVT can BE a mentor. Share your knowledge and years of service to make a clinic run smooth.

Emergency/Specialty Practice: If you love the adrenaline rush, ER is for you! Emergency and Specialty Technicians are constantly developing their skills and advancing their knowledge. The longer you stay the more you will be confident to do advanced procedures. The miracles they perform, keep them coming back.

Veterinary Sales Representative: Sales can be an adventure. Meeting new people, travel, spending allowance, transportation vehicle, and various other perks. Use your veterinary education to promote new products that will benefit the animals and/or veterinary team. Your degree will get a willing audience.

Pet Insurance: Be part of the sales team, or underwriting, to determine approval. If you have experienced medical knowledge and a memory for policies and procedures then this is for you! Some positions or hours are remote. How convenient if you have family members to care for, or physical limitations.

Pet Training: Can't say dog training anymore, because cat training is now possible. Become Fear Free Certified, and provide positive reinforcement training. Remote and in person companies want licensed technicians. Cooperative Care Certification offers training for dogs to learn to participate in and tolerate vet visits and grooming procedures. You can continue to become a CCPDT Certified Professional Dog Trainer, and CBCC Certified Behavior Consultant Canine (knowledge assessed). The certification Council for Professional Dog Trainers maintains a list of resources to help you start your search.

Management: If you wish to gain additional training in practice management, or make yourself more competitive for management opportunities, consider becoming a Certified Veterinary Practice Manager (CVPM).

After Hours Answering Service: Remote communication acting as the direct contact for clients seeking advice and guidance when their clinic is closed. Help clients schedule appointments, provide medical guidance, and other administrative-related queries with questions or concerns about their pet.

Safety Calls: Respond to incoming cases via the telephone, email, and chat regarding potential toxic exposures, poisonings and other adverse events from pet owners and veterinarians related to various household and consumer products, animal health products, plants, OTC products, dietary supplements, prescription drugs, and other chemical exposures.

Teacher: Teach future RVT's your craft. Provide instruction and conduct classes in accordance with the philosophy of the college and within the scope of a defined course of study.

Laboratory: Typically work at veterinary schools, state laboratories, and privately-owned veterinary reference laboratories. Maintain expensive lab equipment and run diagnostic tests.

Research: Research studies conducted by universities and industry often involve the use of laboratory animals. Lab animal vet techs may pursue specialty certification through the Academy of Laboratory Animal Veterinary Technicians and Nurses.

Nutrition: Veterinary nutrition is a popular topic, both within the veterinary profession and among pet owners. Vet techs with additional training in nutrition might work within a general veterinary practice, work with a nutritionist (providing nutritional consultations), or may work with a pet food company (developing and marketing new diets).

Veterinary Associations: Such as NAVTA, Ohio vet tech association, the American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA), and others, often employ a team of veterinary professionals that includes vet techs.

Equine: RVT's assist veterinarians and provide both routine and emergency care for horses. The American Association of Equine Veterinary Technician oversees the certification exam.

Service Dog Organizations/Animal Therapy Organizations: Provide medical care for service dogs who assist children with disabilities and veterans. Here in Ohio you can work with the organizations that were recently featured in the Netflix series "Dogs."

Shelter Medicine: Is dedicated to sheltering, veterinary, and animal behavior to serve animals rescued in cruelty cases and disaster response. You can team up with ASPCA's National Field Response (NFR), Veterinary Forensics, Legal Advocacy & Investigations (LAI), Behavioral Sciences (BST) and Shelter Medicine Services (SMS) teams to ensure well-coordinated operations and high-quality, holistic care for animal victims of neglect, abuse and natural disasters.

Medical Transport: Provide patient care in a 24/7 veterinary ambulatory and medical transport service. Requires full knowledge of restraint techniques, intubation procedures, perform CPR, the ability to triage and take action in emergent situations.

Tutoring - Multiple ways, such as in-Person tutoring, and online tutoring (anywhere and at anytime). Assisting students to pass classes and ultimately the VTNE

WAIVER OF LIMIT OF ONLINE CE HOURS

On March 14, 2020, an Executive Order declaring a state of emergency due to COVID19 was issued.

As a result, numerous live continuing education opportunities were cancelled or developed into webinars or online continuing education events.

The Ohio Veterinary Licensing Board hereby enacts this Resolution to permit unlimited continuing education hours to be obtained online in order to meet the requirements for renewal of a veterinary, limited veterinary, or registered veterinary technician license.

This resolution shall remain in effect for the current renewal cycles of 2021 and 2022.

RVT RENEWAL EXTENDED

RVT licenses typically expire on March 1, 2021.

However, recently enacted COVID legislation extended the expiration date until July 1, 2021 for this renewal period only.

RVTs can renew anytime between January through July 1, 2021 at the regular renewal fee of \$35.00 via credit card.

There is also a \$3.50 processing fee assessed by the State of Ohio. Late fees are assessed immediately after the expiration date of July 1st.

ALL License renewal communications will be sent via email notification only. It is important to notify the Board of any email changes!

Instructions for the ELicensing system are on the Board's web site. No paper applications or checks will be accepted.

Reminder: All ten hours of required continuing education can be obtained through online CE opportunities.
