THE PATH I CHOSE

As many people have said, "I've always wanted to work with animals", I too said those very words. In June of 1974 my dream came true as I graduated from Columbus Technical Institute as a R.A.T. (Registered Animal Technician).

I began working at Graber's Animal Hospital in Toledo just 3 days after graduation and was the first registered technician in the Toledo area. In 1976-77, I served on a committee formed by the Ohio Veterinary Medical Association to form a technician organization. In 1977 under the leadership of Maripat Seiler, RAT, the Ohio Association of Animal Technicians (OAAT) began its existence.

I worked full time at the clinic but still served the Association in various positions starting with District 1 Representative, then Treasurer, then Vice-President, and in 1982 President.

In 1981, my husband, Ken and I adopted a beautiful baby girl, Jennifer, who joined our furbaby Bonnie, the Irish Setter, to make our family complete. Over the next 10 years, I continued working, serving the Association in various positions and on committees, and stayed active on both the local and state levels.

Effective January 1, 1991, the Ohio Veterinary Medical Licensing Board changed our title to veterinary instead of animal and we became Registered Veterinary Technicians, RVT!

In 1996, I had an opportunity to become involved in the education process of veterinary technicians when I served as the VT representative to the AVMA's accreditation committee for Stautzenberger College then located at Southwyck Boulevard in Toledo.

This opened the door to a position on the CVTEA (Committee on Veterinary Education and Activities) which I served for 6 years and a new job for me as Program Manager of Stautzenberger College Veterinary Technician Program.

The position with the CVTEA was one that required traveling, usually flying, around the United States to evaluate VT programs on the AVMA accreditation standards.

This was one of the most rewarding voluntary positions I have ever experienced in my professional career. At the same time, I am learning a new job in which I need to instruct and create lesson plans for students who hopefully have the same passion for the reality of working with animals as I possess.

In 1998 I was appointed by the Governor of the state of Ohio as the first Veterinary Technician member of the Ohio Veterinary Medical Licensing Board.

This appointment opened my eyes to the legal aspect of the veterinary profession, and I served until 2003.

In 2002, I decided to make another career move. This time to a career center teaching juniors and seniors in high school about animal care. Penta Career Center became my new place of employment, and I became a student again myself at the University of Toledo to acquire my teaching certification.

It was a 3-year process and so was my learning curve for teaching high school students! I found myself developing curriculum, teaching an animal component I had never dealt with before, and going back to school at the age of 48. (Who does those things!)

I not only survived but I thrived, and I was the fortunate one to know I made a difference in many young adults minds helping them decide whether a career working with animals was really for them.

In 2014 I retired from teaching but continued to do some relief work in some of the local veterinary clinics. I have continued to support the OAVT and have been serving as their Executive Secretary since 2013.

I have served on the Advisory Committees of both Stautzenberger College and Penta Career Center. I enjoy spoiling my 2 grandchildren and recently moved to Howell, MI after my husband retired at the end of August last year.

I will continue to support the OAVT through membership and in an advisory position as long as I can or am needed.

Not a bad professional path of 47 years!
