OAVT SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

The Finishing Touch: Suture Techniques for the Veterinary Technician. Lecture and Guided Practice Amanda Farnsworth, RVT

This session will provide a comprehensive review of suture materials, characteristics, and basic suture patterns. The review session is followed by a hands-on guided suture practice using suture and patterns Veterinary Technicians commonly use in practice. This two-hour CE will be offered in the morning and afternoon at Discovery 2022. Seating is limited to 30 participants in each offering with an additional fee to reserve seating. All materials for the guided practice will be provided by the OAVT.

Cloud Software for Veterinary Practices. Rainbows and Blue Skies or Lightning and Thunder? Alicia Stephanovich, RVT

With an increase of new practice software, what questions should you be asking to compare our options? Why is cloud software so popular? What are the drivers that are pulling Veterinary Medicine to a shift in software focus? In this presentation we will run through details that will help you understand software trends and if they could benefit your practice. With the rise in compassion fatigue, short staffing, and client demand, is software the answer to change Veterinary Medicine for the better?

Photobiomodulation: Laser Therapy in Veterinary Medicine, more than Physiotherapy. Ashton Thompson

In this lecture, the science behind photobiomodulation (laser therapy) will be discussed. Principles of how this non-invasive modality can decrease inflammation, treat pain, and benefit healing in a variety of conditions in veterinary medicine will be covered. Recent research will be presented alongside real-world cases treated by veterinarians world-wide. The attendee will have an understanding of the science of photobiomodulation and examples of cases which will apply to their own daily veterinary practice.

Urinalysis: Taking the Next Evolutionary Step Forward. Jessica Williamson, DVM

Complete urinalysis is a key part of the minimum database. This CE event focuses on understanding the science behind the importance of the physical, chemical, and sediment portions of a complete urinalysis. As well as clinical techniques to help maximize the diagnostic yield.

Specimen Preparation: How to Get the Most Accurate Results. Jessica Williamson, DVM

Learn how to determine the specimen type needed for specific-in-house or reference lab testing, select the most appropriate collection device and tubes, handle and store specimens, assess specimen quality, and understand the impact specimen quality and handling have on your results.

Large and Small – Enrich Them All. Tiffany Johnson RVT, KPA CTP

During this session, we will be reviewing the different categories of enrichment – what they mean and how to apply it to all of our patients. This will also give you tools to help clients enrich their pet's life.

Understanding Your Dog. Tiffany Johnson RVT, KPA CTP

This session is all about canine body language. We will take a look at individual body parts, along with the whole picture to understand what our patients are trying to communicate.

Don't Blame the Surgical Instruments Part 1 Rick Shultz

This session will discuss why cold soak is not sterile and how to properly clean a sterilizer. We will explain how to prevent instruments from rusting and show the difference between Pakistan and German instruments. We will also learn how to test the ultrasonic cleaner and how to load peel pouches correctly.

Don't Blame the Surgical Instruments Part 2 Rick Shultz

This session will discuss how to test the sharpness of scissors and orthopedic instruments, how to test needle holders and how to test, inspect and clean your surgical instruments. Learn how to properly lubricate instruments and what is so special about gold ring and black ring instruments.

Brachycephalic Anesthesia "Just Give Me the Tube" Chloe Alexander, RVT

Admit it, brachycephalic patients can be pretty cute. Their squishy faces and snorts are adorable when they're within our hospitals. Despite this cuteness overload, they come with specific anatomical abnormalities that may negatively affect anesthetic pre-medication, induction, maintenance, and recovery that the veterinary technician must be prepared for. Join us for this session where we break down Brachycephalic Obstructive Airway Syndrome (BOAS), how it affects each anesthetic period, tips, and tricks to make their surgery visits a little easier, and how to troubleshoot adverse events.

Anesthetic Machine Overview for the Veterinary Technician. Chloe Alexander, RVT

"I've gone most of my adult like not knowing how to troubleshoot my computer when something goes wrong. I frequently call my friend when the "turn it off and back on" trick doesn't work". The same cannot be said for use of an anesthetic machine. The anesthetist should know he ins and outs of this important piece of equipment to reduce risks to both the patient and nearby personnel. This session focuses on an overview of anesthetic machines, circuits, complications that may arise, and how to troubleshoot.
