WHAT IS NEW WITH THE OAVT?

The Veterinary Nurse Initiative, that's what's new! At the November 5, 2017 Executive Board meeting, the current officers of the OAVT signed a position statement giving support to pursue the establishment of the national credential of Registered Veterinary Nurse by the National Association of Veterinary Technicians in America (NAVTA).

Prior to this meeting, we polled our membership, spoke with other RVT's at the Discovery conference and agreed that the majority wanted the Association to support this cause. At that time, only two other states had agreed to lobby for the credential change, Tennessee and Michigan, and so the process began.

House Bill 501, changes the title of "registered veterinary technician" to "registered veterinary nurse" in the Ohio Revised and Administrative Codes and is jointly sponsored by Representative Sarah LaTourette and Representative Stephen Huffman. The bill has been assigned to the Ohio House Agriculture and Rural Development Committee.

The bill undergoes multiple hearings with the first hearing being held on March 6, 2018 which was for the sponsor testimony, then on March 13, 2018, the proponents hearing and the third on March 20, 2018, the opponents testimony. The final hearing will be on April 10, 2018 for the vote.

After the HB 501 passes in the House, it then goes through the same procedures in the Senate. So things are really just in the beginning stages but how exciting to be a part of a national effort and hopefully the first state to spearhead the movement.

Hello!

It is CRUNCH TIME! House Bill 501 - the Veterinary Nurse Initiative is schedule for a vote in the House of Representatives on April 10, 2018.

Proponent Testimony was given on March 13, 2018 by Kenichiro Yagi, NAVTA Representative, Dr. Liesa Stone, President of the OVMA, Dr. Peggy Williams, Instructor/Program Coordinator of CSCC Veterinary Technology program, Kingsly Berlin, RVT, and Melissa Best, RVT/RN. Each individual testimony addressed the various ways the credential change will positively impact the veterinary profession.

On March 20, 2018, the Opponent Testimony was heard. Brian Burger, President of the Ohio Nurses Association, gave testimony against using the title of veterinary nurse. The entire argument revolves around the belief that the title "nurse" has always been linked to the care of humans and that licensure through state statutes limit the use of the title "registered nurse" or similar initials "R.N.".

Please let me clarify that HB 501 is proposing the credential change to "Registered Veterinary Nurse" or R.V.N. NOT V.N. or R.N. and so does not violate the statute as currently written. In fact, Mr. Burger suggested the new title be "Veterinary Practitioner"-needless to say he was corrected as that is what our veterinarians are called.

It is imperative that we start contacting the local state representatives and ask for his/her support of House Bill 501, the veterinary nurse bill. If you have already contacted your representative, please do it again. It is important to get as many people as possible to either email or phone their representative and let them know the importance of supporting this bill. If you work in one district and live in another, please contact both.

I have attached more detailed information with instructions for finding your legislator and a sample email for you to use or refer to. The more you can personalize it to your own situation the better but we need our voices heard!

Please begin emailing <u>now</u> as the most impact for the process occurs between today and Monday April 9, 2018.

If you are interested in being present on April 10, 2018 at the State House in Columbus, our scheduled time will not be announced until Friday April 6, 2018.

CALL TO ACTION FOR HOUSE BILL 501 OHIO VETERINARY NURSE INITIATIVE

Step One: Find out who your Ohio legislators are:

- 1. Go to www.legislature.ohio.gov
- 2. On the right side of the home page, look for the box entitled "Find My Legislators"
- 3. Enter your zip code +4. It is essential that you enter the +4 digits since it will narrow the search down to your exact legislators. If you don't know your extra 4 digits, there is a link on that page to the postal service website which will help you find them). Once you've entered your zip +4, click on "Submit"
- 4. You will then see the name of your Representative (You do not need to contact your Senator at this time).
- 5. Click on the Representative's name. This will bring up his/her legislative website.
- 6. On the right side of the page, look for the Representative's contact information. You will see the legislator's telephone number for their Columbus office. You will also see a link that says, "Email Representative X." Click that link and it will take you to the email contact form.
- 7. Be sure to include your address on the form; this is how the Representative knows that you are a constituent.

Step Two: Send an email

- 1. Be sure to include your name and your HOME mailing address. This is critical; it is how the legislator knows that you are a constituent.
- 2. Follow the email format in the attached example.
- 3. It is extremely important that you put the concepts into your own words form letters are summarily ignored.

Step Three: Follow up with a phone call

- 1. Follow up with a call to your Representative's office within two to three days. You should ask to speak with the legislative aide and tell the aide that you are following up on the email that you sent to the legislator. Ask the aide to have the Representative call you to follow up on your email and to discuss the legislator's position on HB 501.
- In order to impact the process most effectively, all emails and calls should be made by Monday April 9, 2018.



Sample email - HB 501

Dear Representative [LAST NAME]

{PARAGRAPH I} - INTRODUCTION

My name is [YOUR NAME] and I am from [LOCATION, Ohio]. I am writing to ask you to support HB 501, which changes the title of "registered veterinary technician" to "registered veterinary nurse" in the Ohio Revised and Administrative Codes. It is jointly sponsored by Representatives LaTourette and Huffman and is pending in the House Agriculture and Rural Development Committee.

{PARAGRAPH II} - BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Include personal information, including your credentials, experience, and personal connection to this issue, i.e., I care about HB 501 because I have worked as a registered veterinary technician for X years; I work at X clinic...

{PARAGRAPH III} – RATIONALE FOR YOUR POINT OF VIEW (Choose whichever of these rationales "speak" to you and expand with your own personal statements. Do not simply copy these bullet points into your letter; "form letters" do not get noticed.)

I support HB 501 because:

- The title "registered veterinary nurse" more accurately reflects the true nature of our services in the veterinary practice. It allows the public to better understand our role, training, and scope of abilities.
- The bill specifically indicates that there is no change to the scope of practice or certification credentials required for this position; it is a name change only.
- The more accurately descriptive title will allow Ohio's universities, community colleges and career colleges who provide this degree to attract more students to their programs.
- Once the standards nationally are unified under this title, it will allow the registered veterinary nurses to utilize their education and degree in any state, while still allowing each state to regulate its own credentialing.
- The Ohio Veterinary Medical Association and the Ohio Association of Veterinary Technicians support this legislation.

Again, I encourage you to vote for HB 501. I will follow up with a call to your office in a few days to discuss your position on the bill. Thank you for taking the time to consider my position in support of HB 501.
